

**Postcards** have just been sent to all Idaho licensees with schedules of **free Core and reduced cost broker prelicense** classes around the state, paid for with civil penalty fine money. Contact information for each provider is included so you can register for one or more of these courses. Additional courses will be scheduled for the second half of the fiscal year – watch your mailbox for a follow-up postcard. You can also use the Public Database Search on [www.irec.idaho.gov](http://www.irec.idaho.gov) - select the “find a course” tab and click the “course delivered with CP fine money” button for updated course offerings.

**Continuing education courses** taken in another jurisdiction may count for CE, if they fit within the Commission’s approved topics in Rule 402. Further, online courses must be ARELLO certified. However, there is no guarantee IREC will accept out-of-state courses for credit to renew an Idaho license.

The best way to make sure a CE course will be accepted in Idaho is to check the Public Database Search on the IREC website and see if it appears on the list of certified courses. If the course is on the list and offered through an Idaho provider, the course will definitely count for CE. In addition, the provider will submit your attendance to IREC for posting to your record, and there is no need to send in certificates!

If you take a course elsewhere, please submit it to IREC with a [Licensee Request for CE Credit](#) form at least 60 days prior to the end of your renewal period. This time is necessary to review the course or for you to take additional hours in case the course will not apply toward your renewal. Waiting until after you renew your license to find out a course won’t count for CE may result in a CE audit and possible disciplinary action.
